### **Presenter Bios**

**Craig D. Albert, Ph.D.**

Craig D. Albert, Ph.D., is a Professor of Political Science and the Graduate Director of the Master of Arts in Intelligence and Security Studies at Augusta University. His areas of concentration include international relations and security studies, ethnic conflict, cyberterrorism, cyberwar, information operations, and epidemic intelligence. He is widely published, including articles in Defense and Security Analysis, Cyber Defense Review, Journal of Cyber Policy, and Intelligence and National Security. Dr. Albert has also testified before Congress' joint sub-committee of the House Foreign Affairs Committee.

**John J. Heslen, Ph.D.**

Dr. Heslen is an Assistant Professor at Augusta University. He often teaches classes with a focus on intel and cyber issues; recent courses include Intelligence Collection, Cyber Intel and Security, Cyber Conflict: History of Cyber War, and Intro to Intelligence Studies. His research interests include information warfare, cyber security issues, and neurocognitive hacking.

### **Lance Y. Hunter, Ph.D.**

Lance Y. Hunter, Ph.D., is a Professor of International Relations in the Department of Social Sciences at Augusta University. His expertise is in security studies and democratization. Dr. Hunter publishes on a variety of topics, most recently focusing on Covid's effects on democratic and authoritarian regimes, social media's effects on civil conflict, as well as research on social media's effects on domestic terrorism. His recent instruction for MAISS includes Space and Security, Homeland Security, and WMDs and Security.

### **Robert Ross, Ph.D.**

Robert Ross, Ph.D., is an Instructor for the Master of Arts in Intelligence and Security Studies program at Augusta University where he teaches classes on information warfare. He previously served as the Strategic Initiatives Group Chief for the Commanding General of U.S. Army Cyber Command, Fort Eisenhower, Ga and was an assistant professor at the United States Military academy at West Point, Ny where his focus was information technology courses. His research interests are organizational science, strategic foresight, information warfare, 21st century conflict, big data, and cloud computing infrastructure.

### **Josh Rutland, MA**

Josh Rutland is a graduate of Augusta University's Masters in Intelligence and Security Studies program. His research focuses on information warfare, cybersecurity, terrorism, and biosecurity. His work has appeared in journals such as: *Politics and the Life Sciences*, *Politics & Policy*, *Behavioral Sciences of Terrorism and Political Aggression*, *Journal of Cyber Policy*, *The Cyber Defense Review*, and *PLOS Global Public Health*.

Dr. Yufan Yang is an Assistant Professor of Political Science.
