

(U) This infographic provides information on Russian Battalion Tactical Group. Battalion Tactical Group (BTG), a motorized rifle or tank battalion, strengthened by other assets, such as artillery, reconnaissance, and air defense resources. BTGs are like NATO battalion task forces and are ad-hoc organizations, individually created and optimized to fulfill a particular mission.



Personnel: 600-800 officers and soldiers

BTGs are task-organized battalion-plus-sized tactical combat entities that can perform independent combined-arms combat missions. They are similar in purpose, structure, and tactics used by U.S. Army battalion task forces. A common misconception is the BTGs are fixed formation, they have a flexible composition and have units added to perform a required role.

Advantages: The combination of different weapons systems including heavy ones at a low organizational level allows heavy artillery bombardments to be laid on more easily and makes them available for use tactically.

Disadvantages: The Basic BTS's lack of manpower (about 200 infantrymen), means it is not designed to hold ground but to continually inflict casualties while remaining mobile.
